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INTRODUCTION

This annual report of Crime in Wyoming presents data on reported crime from January through December, 2003. Data on reported domestic violence incidents information for January through December, 2003 is also included.

The data presented in this report was compiled from Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) records submitted by contributing law enforcement agencies. These records are designed to collect pertinent standardized data at the city, county and state levels, and were prepared in compliance with the National Uniform Crime Reporting Program standards and definitions.

Agencies prepare UCR forms containing offense, clearance, arrest and supplemental information, and submit monthly reports to the State UCR Program, Criminal Justice Information Section, Division of Criminal Investigation, Office of the Attorney General¹. After processing, the reports are sent to the FBI for use in compilation and analysis of national crime statistics.

Sixty-four individual law enforcement agencies report UCR data, which serve jurisdictions representing 98.7 percent of the State's population². Twenty-three sheriffs' offices and forty-one police departments contributed UCR reports in 2003.

The UCR Program collects data on offenses which are categorized as Part I and Part II crimes³. The Part I crimes include the "Crime Index" offenses of murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft. Arson was added as a Part I offense in 1979, (referred to as the "Modified Crime Index"). For Part I offenses, information regarding the incident, certain supplemental crime information, and arrest data is collected, however, the UCR Program collects only *arrest* data for Part II offenses.

The Domestic Violence Reporting Program information was compiled from data submitted by all Wyoming law enforcement agencies within whose jurisdiction incidents of domestic violence occurred⁴.

The *Hate Crime Reporting Summary* has been compiled in response to the *Hate Crime Statistics Act of 1990*. Its data was received from those agencies submitting reports for each particular quarter of 2003.

OFFENSES IN UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING

Offenses in Uniform Crime Reporting are divided into two groupings designated as Part I and Part II crimes. Information on the number of Part I offenses known to law enforcement, the number of offenses cleared by arrest or exceptional means, and the number of persons arrested are reported. Only arrest data is reported for Part II offenses.

THE PART I OFFENSES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. CRIMINAL HOMICIDE - (a) *Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter*: The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another. Deaths caused by negligence, attempts to kill, assaults to kill, suicides, accidental deaths, and justifiable homicides are excluded. Justifiable homicides are limited to: (1) The killing of a felon by a law enforcement officer in the line of duty; and (2) The killing of a felon, by a private citizen, while in the act of committing a felony, (b) *Manslaughter by Negligence*: The killing of another person through gross negligence. Excludes traffic fatalities. While manslaughter by negligence is a Part I crime, it is not included in the Crime Index.
2. FORCIBLE RAPE - The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Included are rapes by force and attempts or assaults to rape. Statutory rape offenses (no force used/victim under age of consent) are excluded.
3. ROBBERY - The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence by putting the victim in fear.
4. AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Simple assaults are excluded.
5. BURGLARY-BREAKING OR ENTERING - The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. Attempted forcible entry is included.
6. LARCENY-THEFT - (Except motor vehicle theft) - The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Examples are thefts of bicycles or automobile accessories, shoplifting, pocket-picking, or the stealing of any property or article which is not taken by force and violence or by fraud. Attempted larcenies are included. Embezzlement, "con" games, forgery, worthless checks, etc., are excluded.
7. MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT - The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle is self-propelled and runs on the surface and not on rails, Specifically excluded from this category are motorboats, construction equipment, airplanes, and farming equipment.
8. ARSON - Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

THE PART II OFFENSES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

9. OTHER ASSAULTS (Simple) - Assaults or attempted assaults where no weapon was used and which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.
10. FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING - Making, altering, uttering or possession, with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true. Attempts are included

11. FRAUD - Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. Included are larceny by bailee and bad checks except forgeries and counterfeiting.
12. EMBEZZLEMENT - Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to ones care, custody, or control.
13. STOLEN PROPERTY: BUYING, RECEIVING, POSSESSING - Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts.
14. VANDALISM - Willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control.
15. WEAPONS: CARRYING, POSSESSING, ETC. - All violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers. Attempts are included.
16. PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE - Sex offenses of a commercialized nature, such as prostitution, keeping a bawdy house, procuring or transporting women for immoral purposes. Attempts are included.
17. SEX OFFENSES (except forcible rape, prostitution, or commercialized vice) - Statutory rape and offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like. Attempts are included.
18. DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS - State and local offenses relating to narcotic drugs, such as unlawful possession, sale, use, growing and manufacturing of narcotic drugs.
19. GAMBLING - Promoting, permitting or engaging in illegal gambling.
20. OFFENSES AGAINST THE FAMILY AND CHILDREN - Neglect, non-support, desertion, or abuse of family and children.
21. DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE - Driving or operating any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.
22. LIQUOR LAWS - State or local liquor law violations, except "drunkenness" (offense 23) and "driving under the influence" (offense 21). Federal violations are excluded.
23. DRUNKENNESS - Drunkenness or intoxication, except "driving under the influence" (offense 21).
24. DISORDERLY CONDUCT - Breach of peace.
25. VAGRANCY - Vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc.
26. ALL OTHER OFFENSES - All violations of state or local laws, except 1 through 25 and traffic offenses.
27. SUSPICION - No specific offense; suspect released without formal charges being placed.
28. CURFEW AND LOITERING LAWS - Offenses relating to violation of local curfew or loitering ordinances where such laws exist.
29. RUNAWAYS - Limited to juveniles taken into protective custody under provisions of local statutes.

THE CRIME INDEX

The offenses which comprise the Crime Index are all serious, either by their nature or by the frequency with which they occur, and each presents a common law enforcement problem. Crimes within the Index are further categorized as Violent Crimes (murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault) or as Property Crimes (burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft). By congressional mandate, arson was added as a reportable offense in 1979. Its data collection is separate and except where noted as the "Modified Crime Index," it is presented independently of other offense data in this report.

VIOLENT CRIMES

Violent crimes involve the element of personal confrontation between the perpetrator and the victim and entail the use or threat of force or violence. By their very nature, violent crimes are considered more serious than property crimes.

PROPERTY CRIMES

Property crimes entail the attempt or actual taking of someone's property by another. Although property crimes are less serious in nature than their violent crime counterparts of the Index, they represent, by far, the bulk of the total Crime Index.

CLEARANCES

For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, an Index offense is cleared when: 1) a law enforcement agency has identified the offender, 2) there is sufficient evidence to charge the offender, and 3) the offender is actually taken into custody. The arrest of one person can clear several crimes or several persons may be arrested in the process of clearing one offense. Clearances are also recorded in exceptional circumstances when some element beyond the control of the law enforcement agency precludes formal charges being brought against the offender. For example: death of offender; offender incarcerated in another jurisdiction, etc.

CRIME RATES

Crime rates represent the number of crimes in relation to the population of a given jurisdiction. All crime rates presented in this report are per 10,000 population unless otherwise specified. By UCR definition, the victims of forcible rape are always female, therefore the rape rates are per 10,000 females. In addition, the estimated "covered population" represents the Wyoming population that is covered by law enforcement agencies who contributed UCR data, and is the population base used in calculating crime rates.

Crime rates are calculated by dividing the number of offenses by the population and multiplying the result by 10,000. The population base figures used for this report was compiled from two sources: U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census, and the State Department of Administration and Information, Division of Economic Analysis. The initial estimated 2000 Census population count was used for calculation of the 2003 information presented in this report, (Bureau of the Census enumeration and estimates determined by the Wyoming Division of Economic Analysis (formerly Division of Research and Statistics)).

* The Percent Change figures presented in this report were calculated by comparing the number of offenses reported by each contributing agency while controlling for missing reports. If an agency failed to report crime data for one or more months during 2003, the same months were excluded from the comparison with last year's years reports. Given the comparatively low volume of several of the Index offenses, caution must be used when interpreting Percent Change figures since a slight shift in the volume of offenses may result in a large percent change.

Arson property value is an estimate of damage.

FORCIBLE RAPE

Forcible rape is defined in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program as the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Included are attempts or assaults to commit rape. Statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are not included. One offense is counted for each female raped or upon whom an attempt to forcibly rape has been committed.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Aggravated assault is defined as an unlawful attack, or attempt to attack, by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. In other words, all assaults by one person upon another with the intent to kill, maim, or inflict severe bodily injury with the use of any dangerous weapon are classified under one of the aggravated assault categories. It is not necessary that injury result from an aggravated assault when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed.

SIMPLE ASSAULT

The simple assault category includes all assaults which did not involve the use of a firearm, knife/cutting instrument, or other dangerous weapon; also, assaults through the use of personal weapon (hands, fists, feet) which did not involve serious or aggravated bodily injury to the victim. Simple assault is *not* a Crime Index offense, however, it is collected under the assault category for quality control and for the purpose of reviewing total assault violence.

STOLEN & RECOVERED PROPERTY

Supplementary reports relating to the value of property stolen and recovered are also provided by the participation law enforcement agencies. This supplementary report requires a value to be established for property stolen and recovered for each Crime Index offense.

When property is recovered in a different condition than what it was at the time of the theft, that value is used even though it's a lesser amount than when it was stolen. The "*value of property stolen*" refers only to property stolen incidental to crimes which occurred in a particular jurisdiction. Likewise, the "*value of property recovered*" includes only property originally stolen from that jurisdiction. However, it does not matter *who* recovers the property or *where* it was recovered.

INDEX OFFENSES BY CONTRIBUTOR

Crime Index offenses, excluding arson, by county and agency for January through December 2003, are presented in the table of 2003 Index Offenses by Contributor, totals and percent change figures are provided for agency comparison. Given the comparatively low volume of several of the Index offenses, caution must be used when interpreting “*Percent Change*” figures since a slight shift in the volume of offenses may result in a large percent change.

The 2003 estimated covered population figures are presented to provide the base used to calculate the crime rate per 10,000 population. For agencies desiring to calculate rates using their own population figures, the formula is as follows:

$$\text{Rate} = x/y \times 10,000 \quad \text{Where: } x = \text{number of offenses} \\ y = \text{the population base}$$

To alter the “*rate*” figure, substitute another number for 10,000 (1,000, 500, 250). For example, if a community of 1,250 residents experience 49 offenses during the year and would like to know the crime rate per 1,000 residents, the formula would be:

$$\text{Rate} = 49/1,250 \times 1,000$$

Dividing 49 by 1,250 then multiplying that number by 1,000 we get 39.2 offenses per 1,000 residents.

CLEARANCES OF INDEX CRIMES

Index crimes reported can be cleared either by arrest (includes citation & summons) or exceptional means. However, no distinction between cleared by "arrest" and "exceptional means" is made on the report. All index crime "clearances" involve the identity and location of a suspect.

An index crime is "cleared by arrest" or solved for UCR purposes when at least one person is:

1. Arrested, Cited, or Summoned
2. Charged with the commission of the offense: and
3. Turned over to the court for prosecution (whether following arrest, court summons or police citation).

In certain situations, law enforcement is not able to follow the three outlined steps under "cleared by arrest" to clear the offenses known to them. Many times all leads have been exhausted and everything possible has been done in order to clear a case. If the following questions can all be answered "**yes**" the offense can then be cleared "exceptionally" for UCR purposes.

1. Has the investigation definitely established the identity of the offender?
2. Is there enough information to support the arrest, charge, and turning over to the court for prosecution?
3. Is the exact location of the offender known so that the subject could be taken into custody now?
4. Is there some reason outside law enforcement control that precludes arresting, charging and prosecuting the offender?

The administrative closing of a case or the "clearing" of it by departmental policy does not permit exceptionally clearing an offense for UCR purposes, unless all four questions mentioned above can be answered "**yes**".

UCR recognizes the departmental policy in various law enforcement agencies that allow the discontinuance of investigation and administrative closing of cases in which all investigation has been completed. Clearances in accordance with UCR procedures should have no effect on whether an agency has internal policies as to "closing" a case or discontinuing active investigation.

It is reasonable premise that any offense that was "cleared" either had a suspect arrested, cited, summoned or a suspect was located and awaiting arrest, issue of a citation or an issue of a summons. When the suspect was arrested or issued a citation or summons it appears on the "Age, Sex, Race and Ethnic Origin of Person's Arrested"(ASR) form .

If the cleared offense did not show an arrest, citation, or summons entry on the ASR form, at some point in time, it can be assumed that the individual was not prosecuted *and released without prejudice*.

The following table list index crimes "**reported**" and "**cleared**" (either by arrest, citation, summons or exceptional means) and index crime arrests, citations, and summons (A.C.S.Reported) as reported to the Division of Criminal Investigation through the UCR program.

A.C.S. (arrested, cited and summons) percentages greater than 100 are attributed to more than one offender being arrested for a single offense.

PERSONS ARRESTED 2003

Procedures employed in the UCR Program require that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion an individual is taken into custody, notified or cited for committing an offense in an agency's jurisdiction. Although several charges may be placed against a person at the time of arrest, only one arrest (usually the most serious) is counted each separate time he/she is taken into custody. Juvenile arrests are in accordance with the age definition of a juvenile for the National Uniform Crime Reporting Program, which is a person under 18 years of age.

Differences in arrest practices, policies, and enforcement emphasis among agencies influence the volume of arrests for various offenses, particularly those against public order, e.g. drunkenness, simple assault, vagrancy, disorderly conduct and related violations. However, arrest for serious crimes, e.g., robbery or burglary, are more likely to be consistent and uniform throughout all jurisdictions.

LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL

Because of varying demographic and other jurisdictional characteristics, the requirements for law enforcement service differ from one locale to another. For example, the needs of a community having a highly seasonal population may be extremely different from one whose population is relatively stable. In view of differing service requirements and responsibilities, caution must be used when attempting any comparison of law enforcement employee rates. The rates presented in the following tables should be viewed as guides or indicators, not as recommended or desirable police strengths. Adequate manpower for a specific locale can only be determined after thorough study and analysis of the various conditions which contribute to the requirements for law enforcement service in that jurisdiction.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE REPORT

The following domestic violence information was provided by Wyoming law enforcement agencies and compiled by the Criminal Records Section, Division of Criminal Investigation, Office of the Attorney General, in compliance with W.S.S. 7-20-107(a)(b) and W.S.S. 6-4-404.

The Domestic Violence Reporting Program, which began January 1, 1988, reflects domestic violence information as submitted by Wyoming law enforcement agencies on a monthly basis. The following tables provide summary information concerning the number of incidents by county, day of week, time of day, type of violence and disposition.

Factors involved which contribute to the amount of domestic violence incidents reported for any one month include: repeated incidents throughout the month involving the same individuals: one offender/multiple victims; and, mutual confrontation where the involved subjects are both victim and offender.

When more than one type of violence occurs, or multiple dispositions are reported for a single incident, only the most serious and/or consequential action is counted for reporting purposes of this program.

HATE CRIME REPORTING SUMMARY

In response to a growing concern about hate crimes, the President, on April 23, 1990, signed into law the "Hate Crime Statistics Act of 1990" (hereafter "Act"). The Act requires the Attorney General to establish guidelines and collect, as part of the UCR Program, data "about crimes that manifest evidence of prejudice based on race, religion, sexual orientation, or ethnicity, including where appropriate the crimes of murder, non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, aggravated assault, simple assault, intimidation, arson, and destruction, damage or vandalism of property." The Attorney General is required to begin acquiring hate crime data in calendar year 1990. The Attorney General has delegated his responsibilities under the Act to the Director of the FBI. The FBI's Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) Section has been assigned the task of developing the procedures for, and managing implementation of, the collection of hate crime data.

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DIVISION OF CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION

AGENCY HISTORY

The Wyoming Division of Criminal Investigation, was established in 1973, within the Office of the State Attorney General per W.S. 9-1-611. The agency is based in Cheyenne, Wyoming, the State Capitol. The agency also has five field offices located in Casper, Gillette, Green River, Jackson, and Riverton as well as three satellite offices located in Evanston, Powell and Sheridan.

INVESTIGATION JURISDICTION

The Wyoming Division of Criminal Investigation has jurisdiction to conduct criminal investigations per W.S. 9-1-618(a) when requested to by a state, county, or municipal law enforcement agency, or by the county or district attorney of jurisdiction.

The Wyoming Division of Criminal Investigation shall conduct investigations of criminal activity per W.S. 9-1-618(b) when directed by the Governor, when the violations involve the Controlled Substance act or when the violation involves organized crime which crosses jurisdictional boundaries.

INVESTIGATIVE SUPPORT TEAM

The Investigative Support Team is located at the agency headquarters in Cheyenne, Wyoming. The Investigative Support Team assists the State Regional Enforcement Teams or assumes responsibility for the investigation, based upon case load, priorities and expertise in areas such as fraud, homicide, conspiracy, computer and high tech crimes.

The following tables represent DCI's involvement in Wyoming law enforcement. These numbers are representative of DCI activities and are not necessarily reflected in UCR reports from other State jurisdictions.

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Field Operations

The Wyoming Highway Patrol has undergone another significant organizational change during 2003. The retirement of the Operations Commander, two Zone Commanders and the assignment of an existing Major's position as liaison to the newly created Wyoming Office of Homeland Security resulted in restructuring of some upper level commander positions. The two Zone Commander positions (one in Rock Springs and one in Casper) were consolidated into one Field Operations Commander position (Major), assigned to Cheyenne. Each district is now under the command of the District Commander positions (Captains), who report directly to the Field Operations Commander.

During 2003, the Wyoming Highway Patrol spent 125,382 hours patrolling the highways and drove 5,204,527 miles. Troopers wrote 78,036 citations and made 93,203 warning contacts. 36,703 warnings for faulty equipment were also issued. 7,983 assists to disabled motorists were recorded. Troopers investigated 6,277 motor vehicle crashes. 9,102 hours were spent conducting on-scene crash investigations and 6,229 hours were spent in follow-up investigations and report writing.

Highway safety continues to be a top priority and the Patrol works very closely with the Highway Safety Branch of WYDOT. In 2003, the Patrol utilized these 402 fund overtime grants to augment our patrol presence. Three major areas of enforcement under this program are: D.U.I. Enforcement, Speed Enforcement and Construction Zone Enforcement. The Patrol worked approximately 2,500 hours of this grant overtime and resulted in a significant number of speeding citations and arrests for DUI. The increased patrol has undoubtedly made a positive impact on the overall highway safety program.

Drug interdiction is not the Patrol's primary mission, yet, Troopers initiated 98 felony stops. WHP drug detection dogs were involved in 63 of the 98 stops with 81 of these cases being transferred for further investigation to the Wyoming Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI). Troopers seized approximately 2,345.44 pounds of illegal narcotics with an estimated street value of \$14,477,509. In addition to the narcotics, \$791,551 in U.S. currency was recovered.

In response to our 2002 interdiction report to the Rocky Mountain High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA), Tom Gorman, HIDTA Director, praised the Patrol's drug interdiction effort as "the model for highway interdiction, follow-up and coordination with appropriate drug enforcement units."

The Capitol Protective Services division of the patrol has evolved into a fully functioning division of troopers in the Cheyenne area whose responsibilities include providing limited law enforcement services in and around state properties in the Capitol Complex area of Cheyenne as well as responsibility for traffic related calls and activities on the Cheyenne marginal highway system. Cross training for CPS troopers has helped develop a broad range of duties related to the CPS assignment. Troopers from the division provide protective services for the Governor during his travel's outside of the capitol both in state and out of state. A full time uniformed trooper

presence is maintained during working hours in the capitol building at the law enforcement desk. Capitol Protective Services works closely with the newly created state Office of Homeland Security as programs and policies are developed relative to Wyoming's homeland security efforts.

The Special Services Squad was deployed for two major events requiring enhanced patrol presence. The annual "Ham & Jam" Motorcycle Rally celebrated by communities in the Northeastern part of the state involved enthusiasts from all over the country, and required the presence of the Special Services Squad and additional members of the Patrol during the first full week in August. These officers worked overtime providing safety to the motoring public on the highways and localities in the area. A total of forty-seven (47) officers were assigned this enforcement task yielding two-hundred (200) citations, five hundred twenty-six (526) warnings, and forty-four(44) motorist assists. There were six (6) motorcycle involved crashes, resulting in six(6) injuries and no fatalities. This celebration burdens the Patrol both physically and financially, however, there is no doubt the Patrol's presence exhibits the positive effects by their attendance during this venture.

The Special Services Squad was also deployed to the Evanston area over the Memorial Day weekend for another motorcycle rally. The "Easy Rider Rally" anticipated several thousand riders in attendance for the music concerts and rides scheduled during this event. In addition to the normal Division "D" members, twelve additional squad members were detailed to the area to monitor the festivities. This event, touted as a "national run" for a major motorcycle gang, the Banditos, resulted in no reported motorcycle crashes or fatalities over the weekend rally.

WHP Commercial Carrier

In conjunction with the Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP) grant, the Commercial Carrier Program continued to enforce both the state and federal regulations and laws governing commercial motor vehicles. Inspections of commercial motor vehicles and their drivers made up the bulk of the Program's enforcement efforts, along with the compliance reviews on intrastate carriers. Motor carrier officers conducted 3,843 inspections with 22% percent of the vehicles being placed out-of-service. Total violations were 10,248 including vehicles and drivers. We have 14 non-motor carrier officers contributing to the MCSAP program by conducting 909 inspections with 24% percent of the vehicles being placed out-of-service. Total violations were 3,622 including vehicles and drivers.

The Commercial Carrier Program participated in a joint operation with the U.S. Park Service to conduct bus inspections in Yellowstone National Park for the fifth year. The detailed resulted in 42 bus inspections with 7% of the vehicles and 4% of the drivers being placed out-of-service. In addition to the large buses, 13 trucks were inspected resulting in 23% of the vehicles and 7% of the drivers placed out-of-service.

Thirteen motor carrier officers, three POE Level 1 inspectors and two compliance review inspectors participated in the 2003 Roadcheck for International Highway Week. Inspections were conducted at Cheyenne POE on I-25 northbound and Evanston POE on I-80 eastbound. There were 327 inspections conducted in the three day Roadcheck detail. There were 86 no violations and 36 citations issued. The out-of-service (OOS) rates for this exercise resulted in 23% of the vehicles and 4% of the drivers were placed out-of-service. The major OOS violations were brakes, lighting and hours of service.

Four 48 hour inspection details were conducted in FY 2003. On October 8 and 9, 2003, a detail was conducted in the Gillette and Sundance area. We conducted 75 inspections with 28% of vehicles OOS and 1% of the drivers OOS. The second 48 hour detail was held on October 15 and 16, 2002, in Kemmerer and Pinedale/Big Piney. We conducted 79 inspections with 41% of vehicles OOS and 10% of the drivers OOS. The last detail of FY 2003 was held in Jackson/Alpine area on August 26 and 27, 2003. This detail resulted in 67 inspections with 51% of the vehicles and 10% of the drivers placed out-of-service.

Our Compliance Review Inspectors have conducted 120 reviews and continue to be a very successful part of the Commercial Carrier Program. Our inspectors conduct follow-up reviews to make sure the carriers comply with recommendations given at the time of the review. At the time the carrier does comply with the rules and regulations, we acknowledge their accomplishment with a letter of recognition and various safety information. For those carriers that fail to come within compliance possible enforcement action may be taken.

MCSAP continues to be evaluated through a performance-based system. In an effort to reduce the commercial motor vehicle crashes on I-80, which is still our high crash corridor, Commercial Carrier will continue the billboard campaign along this route with the "NO ZONE" message for FY2004. We are still continuing to utilize the winter and summer driving videos and informational pamphlet for the commercial vehicle operators.

By the end of calendar year 2003, we will have the Motor Carrier Website completely functional which will be the beginning of our CVISN/TRACS program. The website and these programs will assist the State of Wyoming and the trucking industry to work together to promote safer highways.

WHP Ports of Entry

To help preserve the existing transportation system, the ports of entry weighed 690,853 commercial vehicles, of which 21,469 were overweight. Mobile Enforcement and Education Teams (MEET) weighed 1,234 commercial vehicles and found 174 trucks overweight.

To enhance safety for the transportation system, the ports of entry conducted 2,310 vehicle/driver safety inspections and an additional 7,216 driver-only inspections finding 71 drivers that had a detectable amount of alcohol in their system. The MEET teams conducted 203 vehicle/driver safety inspections and 182 driver-only safety inspections.

The ports of entry cleared 2,091,906 commercial vehicles by having the drivers come into the location and checking credentials. Over 600,000 commercial vehicles were cleared using PrePass, Certified Quality Carrier program, or the green light system. These three operations allow known qualified vehicles to clear a location without the driver having to get out of the vehicle. This saves time for the carriers and gives the port officers the ability to concentrate on other safety efforts or drivers who need assistance and attention.

The ports of entry assisted in fairly and equitably fulfilling regulatory and revenue generating responsibilities by issuing 96,702 permits, 1,173 Mobile Machinery decals, 877 official receipts and collecting \$4,140,962.41 in fees. The MEET teams issued 132 permits. The ports of entry also issued 138 emergency response permits generating an additional \$62,400.00.

The thirteen year old Weight-in-Motion (WIM) scales have been repaired and upgraded at the Evanston, Cheyenne I-80, and the Cheyenne I-25 ports of entry. The WIM's allow for faster clearance of vehicles by screening weights and height then directing them to the parking lot or to the static scales for further evaluation. The Sundance port of entry had a new three platform scale installed. This allows for most combinations to be weighed at once by simultaneously displaying the steering, drive, trailer, and gross weights. New scale decks for the three platform scale were also installed at the Kemmerer port of entry in conjunction with the reconstruction of the parking lot.

At the end of the year a new van was equipped and assigned to the northeast MEET based in Gillette. This will allow for more MEET details and broader coverage throughout the state in an effort to reduce the number of noncompliant carriers. A MEET vehicle has been ordered for a west team and is scheduled for deployment in

2004.

With the cooperation of the Wyoming Livestock Board and WYDOT's IT staff, the ports have implemented the StockTrail program. This program enables the ports and the Livestock Board to have near real time information regarding livestock movements into or out of Wyoming. This allows the Livestock Board the ability too more closely monitor legal and illegal livestock movements.

WHP Safety, Training, and Records

The Safety, Training and Records Program guides the Patrol's training and safety education activities. It oversees the selection and training of new officers, coordinates the promotional process for supervisory positions and manages all the records and data produced by the troopers' enforcement activities.

Safety Section

The Patrol Safety Education program provided 26,000 people with 602 hours of activities including the following :

The Rollover Simulator, the Seat Belt Convincer, and Crashed Car Displays utilize severely damaged vehicles to demonstrate the benefit of wearing a properly fastened seat belt.

The Child Passenger Seat program provides child safety seats for those who could not afford them. Currently we have given away 68 child safety seats. We have 15 certified technicians across the state who assist with the proper installation of child safety seats.

This year was the first annual child safety seat inspection station held in Lander.

The Seatbelt Survivor program continues to grow. It recognizes people who were spared from fatal or serious injury as a result of their proper use of safety belts or child restraints. The Safety education program partners with the Wyoming Highway Patrol Association to recognize a Seatbelt Survivor of the year.

The Patrol continues to use its Li'l Convincer program to show young children the benefits of safety belts and to help inspire them to buckle up. Each division has its own display, which uses a miniature seat and safety belt system. The children are encouraged to share what they learned with their families.

This year the safety program provided bicycle helmets to students at Afflerbeck school in Cheyenne. Over 500 helmets were handed out.

Training Section

Again this year we conducted two WHP recruit academies. We had five officers in the spring class and an additional ten officers this fall. These officers received more than 2,780 hours of training during their twenty week programs. They will complete their training program with three additional weeks of advanced training in the spring of 2004.

After completing eleven weeks of basic peace officer training at the Wyoming Law Enforcement Academy, recruits attend the eight week Wyoming Highway Patrol Academy to obtain the essential Patrol training before starting a field training ride along program. The field training officer continues to build on the training process for approximately six weeks. Finally, within the first 12 month period, recruits attend a three-week Advanced Trooper class to give them additional training in advanced crash investigation, commercial vehicle inspection and criminal interdiction.

WHP Troopers received 13,539 hours of specialized training in criminal interdiction, advanced crash investigation, commercial vehicle inspections and enforcement, firearms and defensive tactics.

Additionally, WHP provided more than 2,300 hours of training to outside agencies on radar use, driving under the influence (DUI) enforcement, traffic law, crash investigation, criminal interdiction and emergency vehicle operations.

Records Section

The records section is an integral part of the Patrol. Section personnel enter each citation, warning, commercial vehicle inspection, and vehicle searched, as well as the daily activity logs for every Patrol officer. As enforcement activities increase each year Records' work load also increases. The Staff creates an important intelligence base that can be accessed for investigative purposes and statistical information gathering.

WHP Dispatch, Evidence, and Equipment

Dispatch

The Highway Patrol dispatch center continues to provide a communication link between the public, law enforcement and other agencies. Besides Highway Patrol troopers, the dispatch center also provides communication and services for officers who use the State Agency Law Enforcement Communications System (SALECS). Agencies utilizing the SALECS system include Wyoming Game and Fish, State Parks, Livestock Board, brand inspectors and law enforcement for US Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management and Wyoming Outfitters and Professional Guides.

Each year the Highway Patrol dispatch center experiences an increasing number of traffic complaints and calls for assistance from the public. Increased law enforcement activities have also generated more calls for service from officers. During FY 2003 the dispatch center logged 225,052 events, of which 211,310 related to Highway Patrol activities and 13,742 related to SALECS agencies. Vehicle stops (115,397), motorist assists (17,392) and reported crashes (10,763) accounted for the majority of Patrol events logged. Throughout the year the dispatch center also supplied additional staff and support to accommodate increased activity associated with holiday weekends, Operation Diligent Warrior, Hulett Ham and Jam and a March snowstorm which closed offices and hampered travel for several days in southeast Wyoming.

Several dispatchers received recognition for their efforts from the public and their peers. One dispatcher received the Association of Public Safety Communications Officers Dispatcher of the Year award.

Recruitment and retention of dispatchers continues to be a goal and significant challenge for the dispatch center. While six new people were hired, dispatcher basic training classes were delayed until a sufficient number of qualified applicants became available. Competition for personnel from other dispatch centers in the area, the demands of a dispatcher position and shift work have all contributed toward the difficulty in recruiting and retaining new people.

This year all dispatch personnel benefitted from a variety of work related training, principally provided through WYDOT and the Wyoming Law Enforcement Academy. Dispatchers also received training and access certification for the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) and the Wyoming Criminal Justice Information Network (WCJIN) files which underwent a software change.

At the end of the year plans and preparations were underway for the acquisition of a new recording system, an upgrade to the computer aided dispatch (CAD) system and increased security for the dispatch center in FY 2004.

Evidence and Recovered Property

The evidence and property program continued to evolve with the development of a new syringe policy to address serious safety issues surrounding syringes and a revised Video Camera Policy to address the myriad of issues involved with in-car cameras. Specifically related to evidence being storage and retrieval issues.

From October 1, 2002 to September 30, 2003, Troopers collected 2,333 items either as evidence of a felony or misdemeanor crime or as property either found or taken for safekeeping.

Disposition of evidence and property on a regular basis remains a critical element of the program for a number of reasons. One of which is to maintain adequate space in the 1,200 square foot annex for the evidence and property transferred to Cheyenne from division offices around the state.

In accordance with the revised Video Camera Policy, evidence personnel collected and transferred 8,835 8mm and 477 VHS video tapes to Headquarters. Storage and retrieval options are being explored to address the five-year retention of video tape evidence. Trooper's in-car cameras create video tape evidence. That evidence has emerged as a major component of the Wyoming Highway Patrol evidence program.

Inventory and Equipment

The Highway Patrols Inventory and Equipment Section is charged with identifying and procuring equipment, vehicles and supplies necessary to meet the ongoing needs of our field and Port of Entry officers. In late FY 2002, former Governor Jim Geringer approved a request by WYDOT Director Dover to hiring 10 additional Troopers to help keep Interstate 80 open during the winter months. On October 1, 2002, the Inventory and Equipment Section began procuring the needed equipment and vehicles to properly equip these 10 additional officers. Everything from new patrol vehicles to weapons, uniforms, supplies, and miscellaneous items were identified and acquired.

In June 2003, the Patrol began the process of procuring new handguns and related equipment for our officers. We are expecting delivery of the new handguns by the middle of February 2004. This became necessary because of the serviceability and age of our current handguns.

The Wyoming Department of Homeland Security provided personnel protective equipment to each sworn officer of the Patrol. Each kit contained a respirator, protective coveralls, gloves and protective goggles.
